## MHS MUDGEE BUS TRIP - October 2024



Early on Sunday morning, 13<sup>th</sup> October our bus driver, Ron collected all 49 guests boarded the Sid Foggs coach at various locations and then we headed north-west to Denman for our first stop. We enjoyed morning tea in the park which included some delightful cakes and slices. After morning tea we continued on west and climbed the Great Divide which had some very steep inclines. We went through Rylong and continued on to Kandos where a local guide boarded the bus. He took us on a detailed tour of Kandos pointing out numerous interesting locations. refreshment or two at the motel happy hour, then a great 2 course meal to complete an enjoyable day.

After lunch, we drove out to Goree Park, a well-established Horse Stud, but also a winery, sheep and cattle producer, together with vegetable gardens and fruit orchard. The stud also has a 2000m race track which featured in our 2.5 hour tour of the property (20,000 acres). After the tour we were treated to a wine tasting of some fine tipples. We then retreated back to the Winning Post Motel in time for happy hour then dinner.

Day 3, After breakfast we were off to Gulgong where a "local identity" boarded the bus and gave us a very interesting story of Gulgong's history pointing out the Henry Lawson Centre, the Prince of Wales Opera House where Dame Nellie Melba sang. After the tour we went to the Pioneer Museum which had some fascinating exhibits, probably you would need a whole day to take in all the exhibits.
